During most recent visit in June 2023, Ofsted reported that:



AN EXCITING CURRICULUM

Our ambitious and knowledge-rich curriculum ensures that pupils gain a high-quality education. We place appropriate emphasis on English, humanities, maths, science and languages to ensure a broad foundation for learning. Pupils are also offered lessons in music, drama, art and PE. There is a broad and balanced approach to curriculum to ensure that Key Stage 3 is enriching and rewarding, setting pupils up for the challenge of GCSEs.

Each day at Fulwood begins with tutor time or assembly. In form time pupils study Personal Development, engage in discussion and read together. Tutors get to know their pupils well as individuals so that they can provide excellent support and care.

In the classroom, lessons are carefully planned with learning focused on engaging pupils with the best knowledge and skills taught in the right order.

Homelearning and extracurricular opportunities help to give pupils a fully rounded and challenging experience that

gives them the confidence to contribute to their community and also the wider world.

Our teachers are supported and challenged through focused training to inspire the best in each pupil to ensure that each pupil is in turn challenged to become the best learner they can be.

In Year 10 pupils specialise their subject choices with 80% of pupils choosing to study a language to GCSE. In Year 11 we are committed to offering our pupils a slightly longer day to include time for fully-supported study to ensure the best futures at GCSE and beyond.

PASTORAL

At Fulwood Academy we pride ourselves on the quality of support, care and guidance given to individual pupils. At the heart of this provision is a pastoral support system led by a Head of Year.

Our pastoral system provides your child with the care they need to succeed in school whilst allowing them to nurture friendships and develop a strong sense of community.

As your child progresses through Fulwood Academy, their attainment and well-being will be closely monitored, ensuring that pupils are recognised and rewarded when they succeed and supported in overcoming barriers to their learning.

Pupils will be looked after by their Form Tutor who is the first point of contact. These teachers get to know your child very well, encouraging them to be the best they can be and will offer the highest levels of pastoral care to ensure they are safe, healthy and happy. We place great value on the importance of parental partnerships which are vitally important in preparing our pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities, and experiences of adult life. Communication is very important, and you will receive regular updates about your child's progress through termly reports, online data and Parents' Evenings.

TRANSITION ARRANGEMENTS

At Fulwood Academy we understand that the transition from primary to secondary education can be both an exciting and challenging time for pupils and parents.

Our transition programme is designed to ensure that pupils are confident and happy about moving up to Fulwood Academy. We start to meet pupils in Year 5 and build up to a full school visit in the summer term of Year 6. This two-year process ensures that all our pupils are ready for a successful and enjoyable Year 7.

If you have any questions regarding transition at any stage of the process, please do not hesitate to ask. Staff are always available to answer questions at the various transition events, or you can telephone or email the school at any time. **Autumn Term:** Year 6 pupils and parents are invited to an open evening to look around Fulwood Academy and meet members of staff in all the teaching departments.

Spring Term: Year 6. Data will be collected from the primary feeder schools to help arrange admissions.

Summer Term: Year 6. A member of the Pastoral Team and the Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator will visit primary schools to talk to pupils and staff.

Summer Term: Year 6 pupils will visit Fulwood Academy with their classmates for a 'Taster Day' to allow them to familiarise themselves with the school. Pupils who require, can have additional visits.
